6. Dave Tipton, the state Bike Ped coordinator, and Council members had a discussion of railtrail projects, general bike/ped issues and what each can do.

Dave was asked if one of the Departments in state government would be willing to do the next railbanking on the Dawkins and in the future railbank abandonments as a matter of policy. Keith and Cheryl to follow up with Jodie Mc Donald in the Department of Local Government who is the RT coordinator and with Jeremy Edgeworth in the Transportation Department who identifies the abandonments.

7. Daniel Delph from the Ride to Conquer Cancer sponsored by the Norton Center in Louisville presented information on their ride scheduled for the last week in September for 2000 riders. It is a 150 mile overnight from Louisville to Lexington and back. People can ride as individuals or teams. Each individual needs to raise \$2500. Donated money would go to the Norton Center for cancer research. The ride would like KRTC to support and register for the ride either through individuals or a team. Signage is a possibility at gathering points along the ride even if KRTC does not have riders or a team.
